Churches Count on Nature – Sun 15 June, after the 9:30 or 11:15 services: Do you have 15 minutes to join in the fun this Sunday?



On Sunday 8 June we conducted the first of our two surveys of the churchyard. In around an hour, in a small area around the graves, we found over 40 species of plant and insect. But there are lots more species to find!
