Other News

Weekend closure of the Cobham Road bridge (over the M25), Stoke D'Abernon, Surrey - 9pm Friday 27 June to 6am Monday 30 June 2025: This essential work will ensure the continued safety and reliability of the bridge, extend its useable lifespan, and reduce the risk of unplanned closures at short notice. The bridge will be closed over two weekends to



safely complete some of the required work activities. The first full weekend closure, where they'll re-waterproof the bridge and replace an expansion joint at the southern end of the bridge, is planned between 9pm Friday 27 June and 6am Monday 30 June 2025. They'll be able to safely complete the rest of their work overnight, closing the bridge between 9pm and 6am on Monday 30 June, Tuesday 1 and Wednesday 2 July. When the Cobham Road bridge is closed, directly above the M25, there will be a fully signed diversion route via Leatherhead

Contingency closures - In case we need to reschedule this work, we've arranged two contingency closures between 11-14 July and 18-21 July 2025 (9pm Friday to 6am Monday). Should our work go as planned, however, these additional weekend closures won't be required and won't be installed.

Additional information - A second full weekend closure is expected to take place later in the year and we'll provide details of this when the date is confirmed.

Please check their webpage www.nationalhighways.co.uk/se-maintenance for updates and look out for temporary signs at the roadside, which will provide advance notice of scheduled closures.
